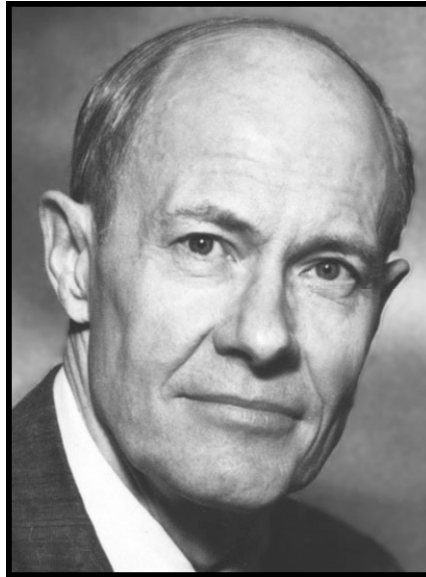


Glenn Robertson Lewis
1920 ~ 2011



Glenn Robertson Lewis, age 91, passed away on Tuesday, Sept. 27, 2011 at his home in Sandy, Utah from cancer.

Glenn was born July 5, 1920, at a sheep ranch "labor" house near Byron, Wyoming.

Glenn was the third child of Edmund Elroy Lewis and Ellen (Ella) Robertson. Preceding him in death was his oldest brother, Elroy, older sister, Veloy and younger sister, Elna. His youngest brother Mark, currently lives in Cowley, Wyoming.

Glenn grew up in Cowley, Wyo. and graduated from the Univer. of Wyo. He married LeNore Bagley of Cheyenne, Wyoming in the Logan Temple on July 21, 1944.

In WWII Glenn served our nation as a second Lieutenant in 1944. After the war, Glenn and LeNore moved to Powell, Wyo. in 1946 where he operated Glenn Lewis Accounting Office for nearly forty years.

Glenn and LeNore were blessed with six children: David, Grant, JoEllen, Donald, Diane and Robert. Glenn was preceded in death by sons Robert (July 1962), Grant (Feb. 1982), and David (Nov. 2006), and his dear companion, LeNore (Feb. 1988).

Glenn and LeNore moved to Sandy, Utah in 1984. After LeNore's passing, Glenn married Jean Canning (Newswander) of Afton, Wyoming in the Logan Temple on February 4, 1989.

A lifelong member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Glenn served in many responsible callings including ward Bishop, Temple Ordinance worker, and High Priest Group Leader. Glenn and Jean served 3 missions in the Salt Lake area.

Glenn's greatest joy was spending time with his family. He is survived by his wife, Jean, three children, twenty-two grandchildren, and forty-six great grandchildren.

Glenn R. Lewis' greatest knowledge was his testimony of the restored gospel of Jesus Christ.

Services will be held in Sandy, Utah on Saturday, October 8, at noon, at the LDS Canyon View Ward chapel, 9119 S. 1300 E., followed by the graveside services at Wasatch Lawn Memorial Park, 3401 South Highland Drive, Salt Lake City, Utah. A viewing will be held on Friday evening, October 7 at Goff Mortuary, 8090 South State St., Midvale, Utah from 6 to 8 p.m., and another viewing will be held at 11 a.m. at the Canyon View Ward chapel on Saturday, October 8.
